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
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New programme aims to boost health and wellbeing of General Practice staff



All NHS staff working in GP practices across Hampshire and Isle of Wight now have access to a new Employee Assistance Programme (EAP) aimed at supporting their health and wellbeing.

The EAP, delivered by wellbeing provider Health Assured, is a confidential service for employees to help deal with personal and professional problems that could be affecting their health and wellbeing.

Available to all General Practice staff including the locum workforce, the EAP will provide both reactive support when someone needs it, as well as proactive and preventative support, covering a wide range of issues including personal, financial and legal matters.

The EAP will also offer:

- Access to 'My Healthy Advantage' health and wellbeing app (download via Google Play or the App Store)
- Counselling sessions
- Legal information on issues such as debt, property or neighbour disputes
- Bereavement support
- Medical advice from qualified nurses
- Online CBT
- Wellbeing workshops on topics such as stress management; nutrition; mental

health; coping with change; trauma; menopause and sleep

Healthwatch staff survey interim results - there is still time to have your say

A Healthwatch survey asking for GP practice staff feedback has been extended and is now open until December 31.

The survey is an important element of a project which is looking at access to GP practice services across the south region.

An important element of this work is ensuring feedback from GP practice staff is also taken on board to understand:

- How their role has changed during the COVID-19 pandemic
- · What practices do well
- What challenges practices face

Healthwatch is looking to boost the number of people who have taken part as

currently uptake is low. The local breakdown is:

- Isle of Wight 44 responses
- Hampshire 26 responses
- Portsmouth 2 responses
- Southampton 0 responses

All feedback is anonymous, so Healthwatch can safely share learning with people, commissioners and primary care providers.

Non-HPV specimens being placed in 'HPV samples only' bags



Practices are being reminded to ensure specimens are being put into the right bags.

The Blood Sciences laboratory at Queen Alexandra Hospital (QA) has received a number of non-HPV specimens from patients which have been incorrectly placed in 'HPV samples only' bags.

These bags are not routinely checked at QA so are then sent to Berkshire and Surrey Pathology Service (BSPS) where all HPV samples should go to be tested.

As BSPS are unable to return the samples, it then means these patients have to be resampled and leads to a delay in results being issued.

Please could all practice staff across Hampshire and the Isle of Wight be reminded that green bags should only contain HPV specimens and anything else placed in there will be rejected for testing. If the sample is non-repeatable such as biopsies and accidently placed in the wrong bag, BSPS will endeavour to return it, but is not always able to.
