Publication of 7/9/2020 updated DoLS and MCA Guidance during current pandemic

The Department of Health & Social Care, on the 7th September have made some changes to the published guidance in relation to The Mental Capacity Act (2005) and Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards during the pandemic.

The NHSE National team have provided the following paragraph in terms of an update:

The main guidance document – ‘The Mental Capacity Act (2005) (MCA) and deprivation of liberty safeguards (DoLS) during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic’ has been updated. Sections ‘Summary of key points’ and ‘Supervisory bodies’ now include updated information about professional visits to care homes and hospitals.

Learning Summary from The Ms. E Safeguarding Adults Review

The Hampshire Safeguarding Adults Board commissioned the Miss E Safeguarding Adults Review (SAR). The review was in relation to a lady in her late 70's where concerns were noted in relation to her care and treatment.

Findings included a lack of personalized care as well as the need for effective multi-disciplinary working and care planning. The report also highlighted the potential difficulties of diagnosing hip fractures in certain patients as well as local processes for ordering of equipment.

Learning Summary from the Ms. D (Sasha) SAR

The Hampshire Safeguarding Adults Board commissioned the Miss D SAR. The review was in relation to Sasha who died in 2017 and was 20 years old.

The review identified important learning around the following key areas:

- The Transition process for young persons
- The need for clear ownership in relation to Multi-Agency action plans and communication
- The need to access Safeguarding advice when managing complex cases
- Management of cross border working
- Understanding and application of the Mental Health Act (1983) and the Mental Capacity Act (2005)

Emollient Cream Fire Safety Message

Following a recent emollients safety campaign by the National Fire Chiefs Council (NFCC), Hampshire Fire and Rescue Service (HFRS) and Isle of Wight Fire and Rescue Service (IWFRS) has put together a webpage and bulletin to raise awareness of the fire risks that can be posed from using emollient creams.

Please be aware that there has not been any fire related deaths in the Hampshire, Southampton, Portsmouth and IOW area involving emollient creams however this publication is being shared to increase knowledge of all agencies and professionals who work with people who use emollient creams, and highlight potential fire risks when using them.

Lasting Power of Attorney Health and Welfare

Nationally the uptake of this legal arrangement is low, yet this arrangement supports patients and professionals to meet people's wishes and can help to avoid the need for complex best interest decisions.
